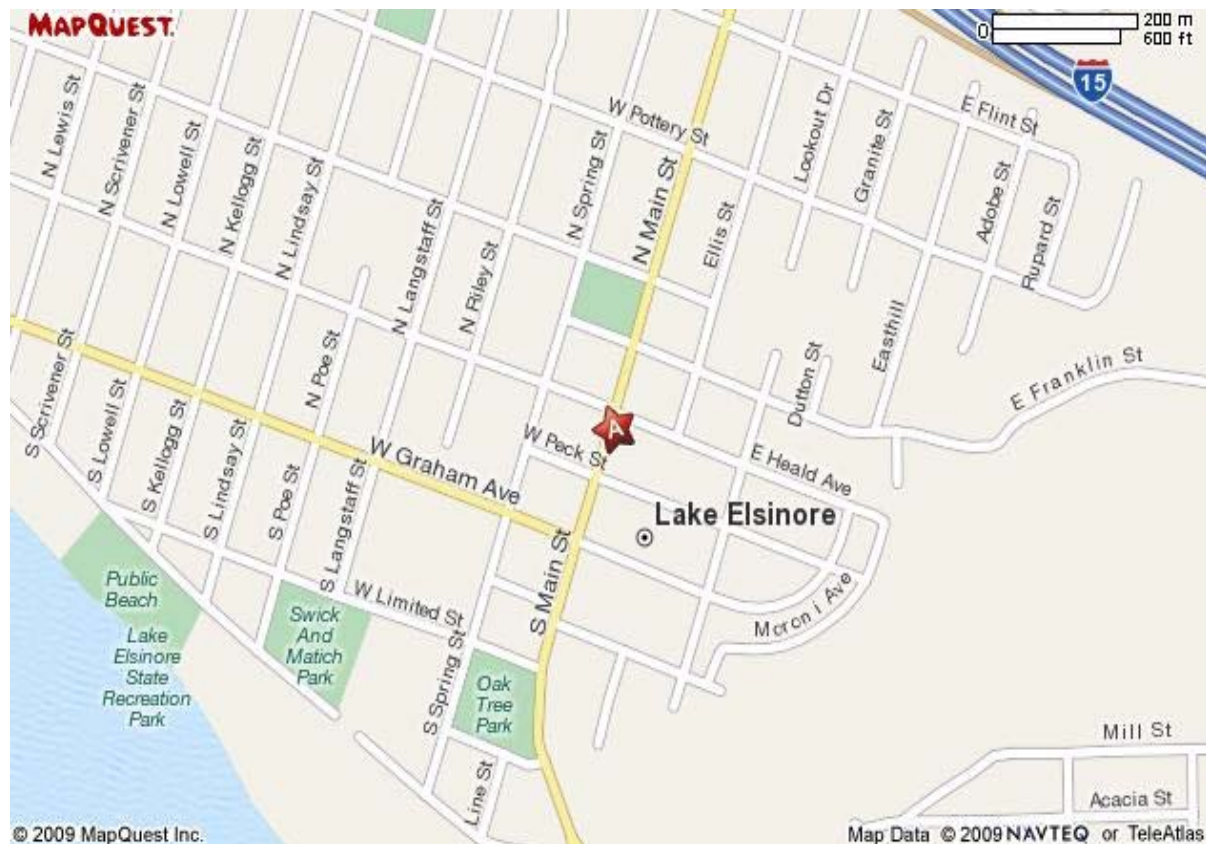

Project Status listed below:

Santa Ana River Trail Impacts/Closures:

- Completed: Jurupa Avenue extension is 95% complete.
- Completed: Metropolitan Water District has completed its work. There were no impacts to the trail.
- Future: The City of Riverside, Southern California Edison, and the District continue to work cooperatively to identify a utility line location. It is the District's goal to minimize impacts to the trail.
- Future: The City of Riverside and the District continue to work cooperatively on the location of a new sewerage line within the Santa Ana Trail Corridor between the Tesquesquite Landfill and the waste treatment plant. An alternate trail route will be identified for impact segments of the trail.

Santa Ana River Trail: (Green River Golf Course to Hwy 71 Bridge)

- The MOU with Transportation Land and Management Agency (TMLA) has been drafted and will be forwarded for review.
- The consulting team met with various public agencies along the Santa Ana River Trail corridor to identify potential impacts and alignment issues.

Santa Ana River Trail: (Hidden Valley)

- The MOU between the District and TLMA has been revised.
- The land easements and permissions continue to progress.
- TLMA notified the District that the requested 'TEA' funding should be available for the projects.

Santa Ana River Trail (Doolittle to Tyler St)

- Project work is 95% complete.

Santa Ana River Trail: (Corona to Hidden Valley)

- The consulting team met with Orange County Water District to discuss the use of lands managed by their district for trail use.
- The consulting design team is addressing the concerns expressed.
- The environmental consultant began its CEQA studies.

Jim Real Regional Trail (Bain Street Trail)

- The work on the second phase of the trail project is in easement negotiation.
- The District is examining the possibility of initiating a third phase to extend the trail to Bellgrave Avenue.

Mockingbird Canyon Trail

- The public “stake holders committee” is being scheduled.
- The consultant has begun the initial environmental studies.

Wine Country Trails

- The draft map is complete and has been submitted for inclusion to the Southwest Area Plan.
- Methods of implementation and maintenance programs are being researched.

Pines to Vines Trail Mapping Effort

- The project team toured the Shipley Reserve to discuss trail access and alignment issues.
- A second tour to review proposed trail alignments is being considered.

Lake Cahuilla Equestrian Campground

- Inclement weather forced the trail work party event to be rescheduled to April 10, 2010.

Items of Interest

- General Plan Update: The draft Circulation Element, Trail Maps and Policies for the General Plan were completed in draft and submitted to the General Plan Team.

Subject: Trail Map Task Force Subcommittee Report

Recommendation: Receive and File

At the initial meeting of the Trail Map Task Force, the subcommittee established a goal of assisting the District in the development of three types of maps:

- 1) Small or pocket sized maps for use while on the trail or in the field.
- 2) Large maps (suitable for display at trailheads or park kiosks) that would inspire future use and encourage further investigation.
- 3) Interactive active maps that would be available online to the public.

The subcommittee is planning to meet again on March 23 to review revised maps and additional map products.
